At summer’s end, we visited over four hundred homes with Gospel tracts and brochures about the church. I had several opportunities to share the Gospel. As I went house to house, I was greeted by many who knew and welcomed me. This is quite a contrast to visiting in those first years in Iceland. Though we didn’t see souls saved on visitation, we also didn’t have doors slammed in our faces - a pleasant change. Thank you for praying over the seeds planted. **The cold winter months** are upon us as daylight time decreases until December 21st when we will have 20 hours of darkness.

Icelandic ministry: In the photo to the left, some adults are preparing for Bible study. This is our lowest attended service, but seeing some adults show interest is such an encouragement. **The ministries** have continued as our home church, Kerwin Baptist Church, has us home for their mission conference. My son and fellow missionary, William, had the joy of running solo without fellow missionaries for September. **William seeks to raise support** to remain on the field and serve. He does not feel called to full-time ministry; however, he works a full-time job and helps greatly in the ministry. I am so pleased to have my sons working with me. We rejoice that a young girl reached in our bus ministry will be baptized on November 10th. We are thankful that her parents have allowed her to take this step. What a joy it is to see a child allowed to follow Jesus!



English-speaking ministry: We continue to hold services on Sunday mornings and Thursdays. This ministry is dedicated to reaching people living in Iceland who do not speak Icelandic. This is a growing need as 40% of our population is now non-Icelandic-speaking immigrants. Churches in the States are also familiar with immigrants who do not learn English. The same is true in

Iceland. This causes cultural tension and increases the burden on Iceland's education system and job economy. Thank you for praying for us as we minister to the *strangers* in Iceland, for we were also once *strangers*. **Family:** My daughter Rosa is due with our first grandchild in March. She and her husband want to move to Kernersville, N.C., to be part of our home church and raise their family there. Thank you for praying for her during the upcoming childbirth and moving from Florida to North Carolina.
