August 24th marks our 25th year serving in Iceland! Praise the Lord!



In June, we had the honor of hosting a **Homecoming** (left and below) of the previous pastors of the First Baptist Church in Iceland. FBC started as a military church in 1983. Groundbreaking in 1994, we have just finished the building 30 years later. The military base closing in 2006 essentially dissolved the church. We inherited both the unfinished building and the remnant English ministry. Until 2006, we had been working exclusively

with Icelandic-speaking nationals. For Homecoming, Pastor Hawtree, Jonathan Lyons, Pastor Baxley, and

FBC founding Pastors Opferman and Wright served as guest speakers. Former members of FBC Iceland, who love the Lord and the church in Iceland provided the majority of the finances needed to finish the building over the past 18 years. The building is a testimony in the community of the grace of God.



Our son, William, was married on Sunday, June 30th, following Homecoming (left). His wife came to our church as a teenager from Germany and trusted Christ. She has committed to serve the Lord with William



in Iceland. We are very excited for them as they join BMFP as missionaries. Their home church is the same as ours, Kerwin Baptist Church. William earned two bachelor's degrees, interned for over one year in two different churches in the States, started a teen church here in Iceland, and hopes to raise as much support as possible without leaving the work in Iceland. Summer camp: July 22-29, we hosted 29 children and 20 workers at the church for six days and nights (right). Fifteen children made decisions for the Lord. Our theme for camp, "This was your life," taught the importance of knowing that God has recorded your life and that there will be an accounting for every choice made. My messages focused on life being a series of choices that produce consequences: "You reap what



you sow." At the end of the six-day camp, we invited the community, the family, and the friends of the campers to share the gospel. This year, every child had at least one parent come, and many had several parents in
