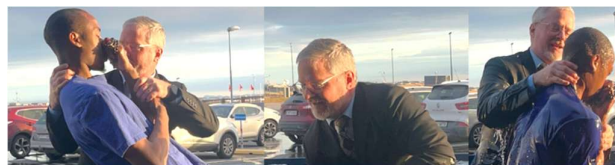


**Icelandic Ministry:** Christmas outreach was a great success. In the photo on the left, you see our choir singing, along with a good crowd in attendance. We saw many first-time visitors come to church. We rejoiced as many of our volunteers signed up to do a special. In the photo below, our youth ministry continues. This bus ministry, in Icelandic, serves children of parents who don't attend church. We hosted a back-to-school roundup featuring a bounce house and popcorn. What a blessing it is to see the youth learning about Christ! I am grateful to our dedicated helpers who make the youth ministry possible. William has been leading the Icelandic-speaking teen church, and attendance has averaged over 20 per week. I am thankful for his leadership in that ministry. It is a joy to see how he loves the ministry. Please remember that he is a missionary on deputation and is also serving full-time on the field. While serving on the field, he is scheduling meetings from September through November to secure full support. He currently has 40% of the support he needs. Please pray about this need. He is not a missionary on deputation who is sharing what he envisions to accomplish when he arrives in the field, as I did nearly 30 years ago. He is a missionary fully engaged in outreach and bringing this church plant forward into the next generation.



**English Ministry:** This ministry is a blessing and a challenge. Many who attend this service are refugees seeking asylum. It was heartbreaking to say goodbye to a family from Venezuela. They received their deportation paperwork this month and departed on the 29<sup>th</sup>. This is one of many stories that have broken our hearts as we see families seeking to escape their horrible conditions, desiring to make Iceland their future home. Sadly, most are rejected after years of waiting. This particular family spent two years hoping, but was not permitted to work here and was ultimately sent away. During their time in Iceland, they found our church and made FBC their "Home away from home." Below is a man who came to church with his family. He spent three months attending with his wife (an Icelander) and daughter. In the first week, he asked about baptism and faith. I asked him to attend church faithfully and listen to the teaching and preaching. Three months later, he approached me after church and said he knows he trusts Jesus and wants to be baptized. It was my joy to baptize him on the last Sunday in January. His wife has also attended faithfully and has asked some insightful questions. We hope this family will become a solid member of FBC.



**Summer Camp:** Dates are June 22-27. Our camp is neither a day camp nor VBS; it is a traditional summer camp where campers stay the entire week and enjoy a summer camp environment away from home. Our home church is sending 8-12 volunteers to help us with camp. Our camp is intended for children and teens who faithfully attend church at FBC throughout the year. We seek sponsorship to ensure these children can attend camp at no cost. There are many good reasons for doing this. The average cost to provide food and supplies for 30 children, 10 teens, and 20 adult staffers (60 total) is over \$200 per attendee. That also supports community outreach on the last day of camp, when the kids' families come to the church to hear about what the Lord did at camp. The last day of camp has been our most significant outreach opportunity to share the Gospel with many who have never heard it. Thank you for your prayers as we prepare now for this big outreach.

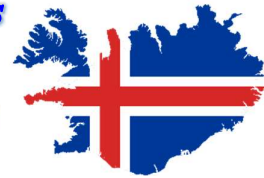
